- 1.7 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *ambulavit*? Conjugate this verb. How does this tense differ from the imperfect (cf. "*Iulia cantabat... tum Marcus eam pulsavit!*")?
- 1.11 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *pulsatus est*? How would it change if it were Julia who was punched? A group of boys (*pueri*)? How is this tense and voice formed? Conjugate this verb. What is its dictionary form?
- 1.13 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *pulsaverunt*? Conjugate this verb. Dictionary form? Present stem? Perfect stem?
- 1.20 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *iacuit*? Conjugate this verb. Dictionary form? Present stem? Perfect stem?
- 1.35 What are the case, number, and gender of *cornibus*? Why this case? To what declension does this noun belong? Decline it.
- 1.65 What part of speech is *aliquis*? What is its neuter form?
- 1.83 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *fui*? Conjugate this verb. What is its dictionary form? Present stem? Perfect stem?
- 1.85 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *fuisse*? Why this mood? What is its dictionary form? Compare the present and perfect infinitives of this verb.
- 1.90 What part of speech is *multa*? What other words commonly function like this?
- 1.97 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *dormivisse*? Why this mood? What is its dictionary form? Compare the present and perfect infinitives of this verb.
- 1.113 What are the person, number, tense, voice, and mood of *scripsit*? Conjugate it. What is its dictionary form? Present stem? Perfect stem?
- 1.119 What are the case, number, and gender of *mihi*? Why this case?
